


Empowering Cross-Agency Collaboration

Innovating for more effective government services

How can government organizations innovate for more effective services? Is it enough to digitize processes, or does transformation require a cultural shift as well?

- 3. Enabling a predictive government response that's prepared to manage crises and proactively ensuring economic stability and individual wellbeing.

Government support touches many communities, including schools, small businesses, healthcare organizations, the unemployed, property owners and renters, and individuals.


Here's how governments might use technology to restore the economy:

Build resiliency by modernizing legacy infrastructure

Legacy systems are quite difficult to scale rapidly, and when they have a failure the fix is often complicated and time-consuming. But these systems can't simply be removed, they need to be phased out. Agencies can build on systems that are working with phased transitions while enabling fast and secure upgrades through the power of the cloud for services that have to be delivered today.

Prioritize data




